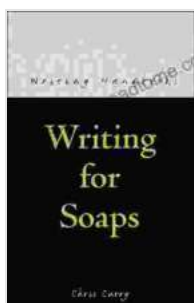

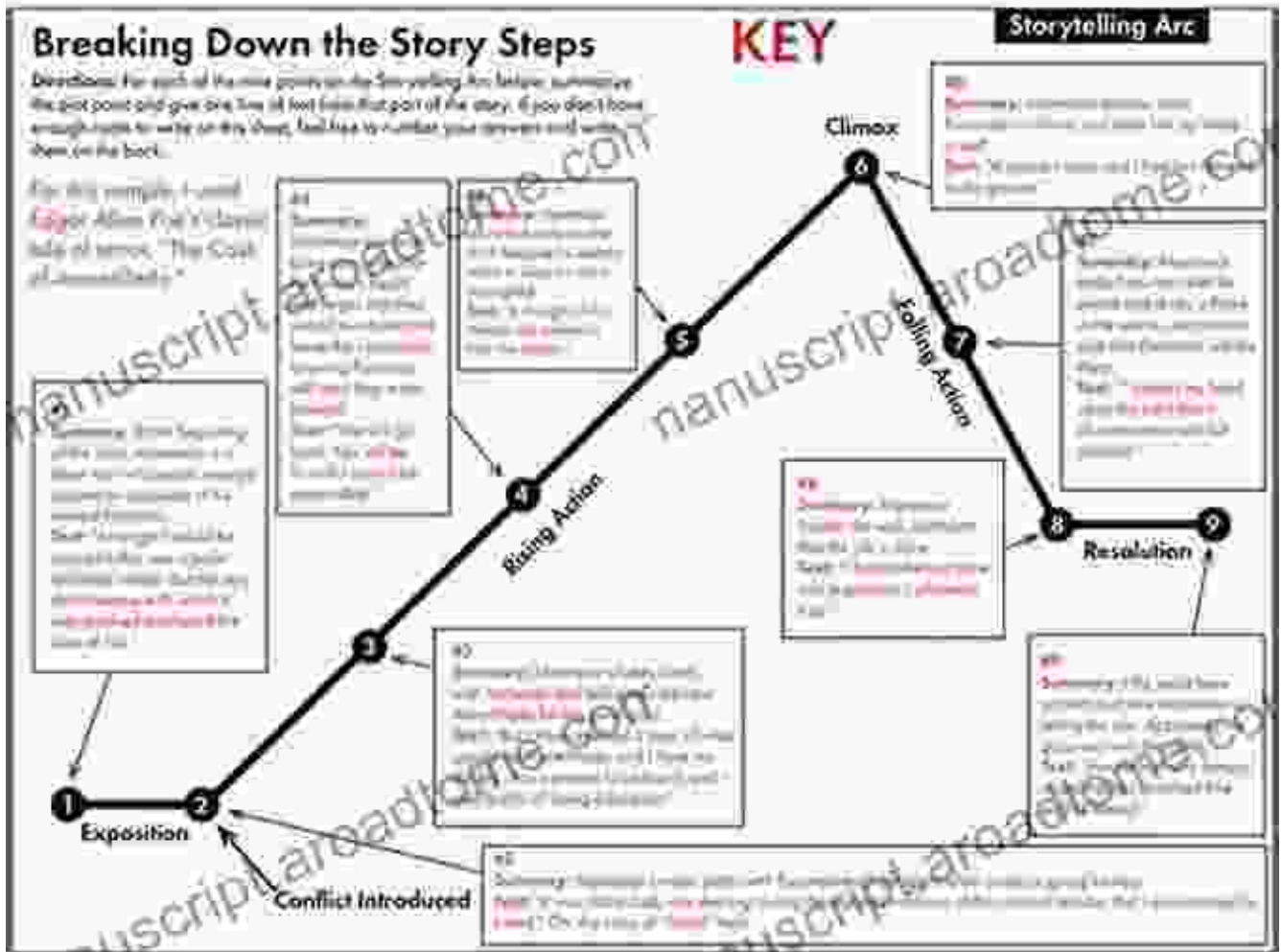

Alice ← TRACEY: Eh, I can pick another reason why he'd give me the flat.

Becky ← BECKY: [LOOKS AT TRACEY, THEN BACK AT STEVE SUSPICIOUSLY]

Luke ← STEVE: [TURNS AROUND RAISES HAND AS A SIGN TO STOP; TURNS TO FACE THEM BOTH] stop it! Your both acting like a pair of kids

Mid long shot, over the shoulder. Steve's back to the camera, Tracey, Becky and Lloyd in background.

Lacey ← BECKY: What's she on about?

Mid close up, over the shoulder.

Alice ← TRACEY: wim, I really don't think you want me to spell it out for you

Luke ← STEVE: Right! Tracey can have the flat I've decided, if she wants.

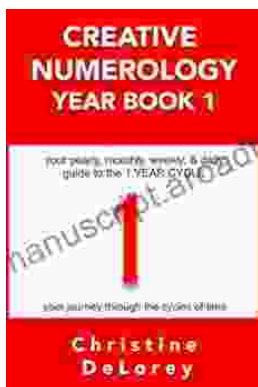
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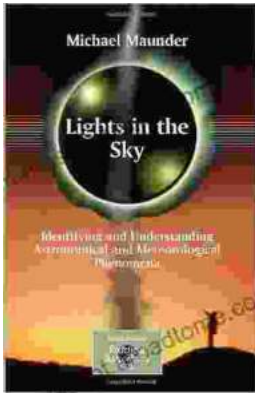
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
